WHAT WE DO

Humanity Unified is a nonprofit organization dedicated to empowering communities in developing countries through education, food security, and sustainable development projects. We work in Consultative Status with the United Nations.

Our mission is to break the cycle of poverty by providing sustainable solutions that promote self-sufficiency and dignity. We believe that every person deserves access to education, healthcare, organic food and clean water, and we work tirelessly to make this a reality.





THE PROBLEM WE'RE SOLVING

At [Humanity Unified](#), we're dedicated to solving the poverty crisis in rural communities. In many of these areas, families struggle to access basic needs such as food, clean water, and healthcare. Children are often forced to drop out of school to help support their families, perpetuating the cycle of poverty.

According to the World Bank, more than 700 million people live in extreme poverty, surviving on less than \$1.90 per day. This includes millions of children who lack access to education, healthcare, and other basic necessities. The problem is especially acute in regions severely affected by climate change, where families face additional challenges such as food insecurity, displacement, and higher rates of disease.

Despite these challenges, there is hope. Humanity Unified believes that every person has the potential to thrive, given the right support and resources. By working with local communities and implementing sustainable solutions, we can break the cycle of poverty and create a brighter future for all.

OUR APPROACH



We take a multi-faceted approach to solving the poverty crisis. Our programs focus on empowering women and girls, providing education and vocational training, developing and maintaining food security and creating sustainable communities. We believe that by investing in these areas, we can break the cycle of poverty and create a brighter future for generations to come.

FOOD + NUTRITION

THE FOOD FOREST & PERMAGARDENS PROJECT

The food forest project creates employment for women farmers, provides organic food to patients at a hospital on-site, and promotes regenerative agriculture in the Huye district of Rwanda. An organic food forest demonstration garden (the first in Rwanda) has been established to train members of the community in permaculture methods and climate resilience initiatives. As the first of many food forest projects we hope to run, fruit trees, a range of nourishing vegetables and medicinal herbs were planted. 110 women have been trained on how to create permagardens on their own land. Each is provided with seeds and receives education in regenerative agriculture, nutrition, wellness and breathwork, WASH (hygiene) and financial planning. These women have become ambassadors, going out among the community to teach other families how to grow nutritious food and form savings groups.

EDUCATION + EMPLOYMENT

ASPIRE PRESCHOOL

The Aspire Preschool provides a safe, nurturing place for 86 children living in extreme poverty to learn, play and thrive. The children enrolled at the Aspire Preschool live in the slums of Kigali, Rwanda. Many would be malnourished, suffer from chronic illness, and fall quickly behind in primary school due to their circumstances if not for the nutritious meals and education they receive each day. Instead, the children are learning English, French, and Kinyarwanda; gardening, dance, play, mathematics, storytelling, and good hygiene practices.

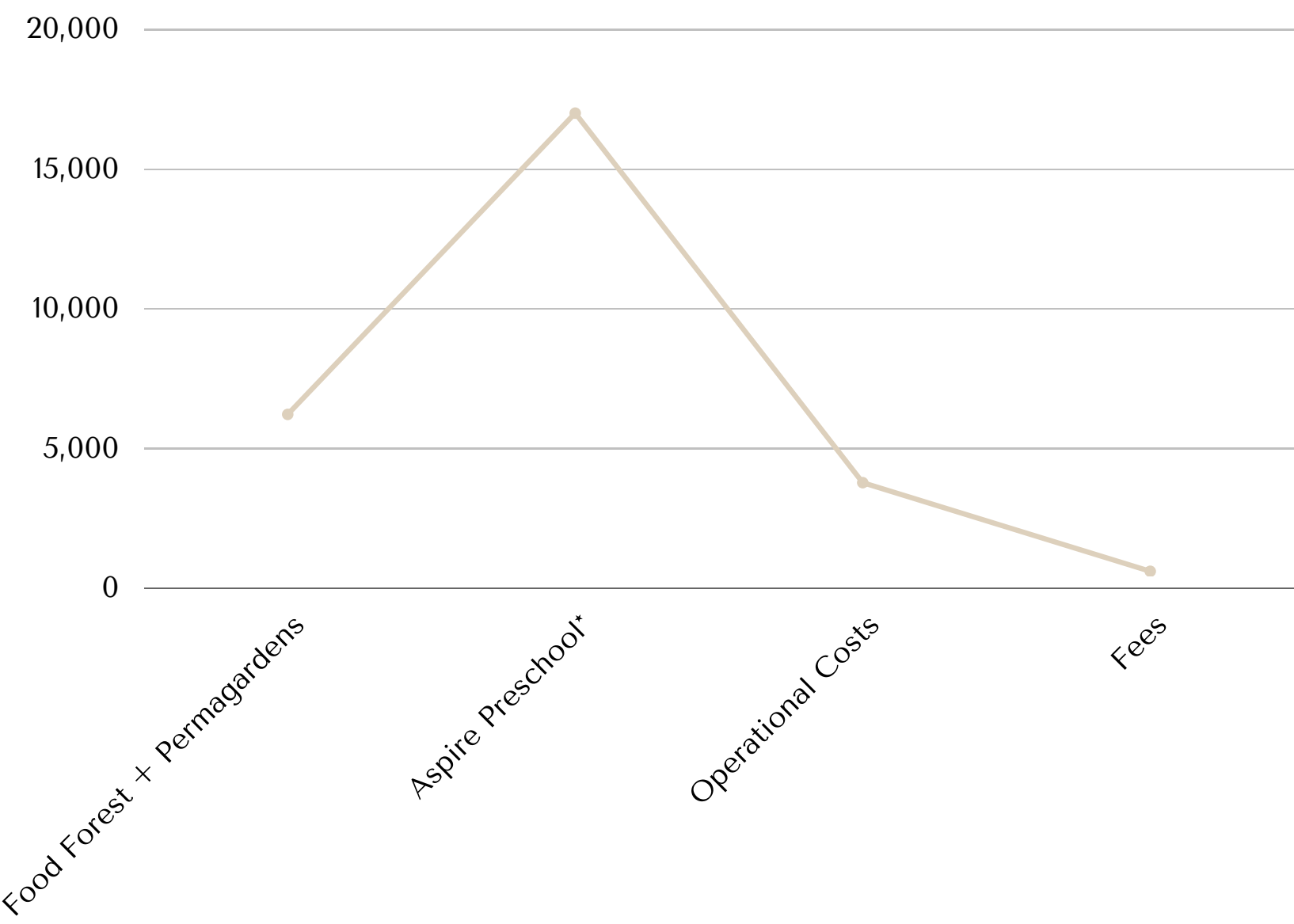
Establishing this school was important for the community because oftentimes small children are left in the care of young female siblings while their mothers are at work. These young girls are not capable of providing proper supervision and are sometimes kept home from school to provide childcare for the family, compounding the problem.



- 30,000** meals were served at the Aspire Preschool
- 86** children attended school, ages 3-6
- 8** staff employed, including teachers and cooks
- All 3** student classrooms received supplies and educational materials
